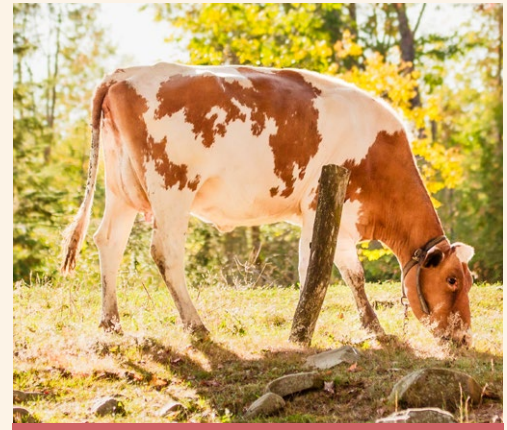

1. **WELCOME AND NATIONAL ANTHEM**

4. **MINUTES OF THE LAST ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

The Chair asked for any errors or omissions in the minutes of the Board meeting of March 28, 2024 that were circulated previously for review.

5. **PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS**

Paul MacLeod delivered a report on behalf of the Association and acknowledged Members and Holstein Canada staff.

6. **ADMINISTRATION REPORT**

Isabelle Passaretti presented highlights of 2024 noting:

- Growth in registration, transfers and membership
- Farm visits included Hidden Lane Dairy, Mar-Ley Farms Inc., and Eby Manor Ltd.
- Summer picnic and classification demo held at Comfort's
- National Show held in September

7. **2024 FINANCIAL REPORT**

Bruce Fuller presented highlights of the financial report for the period ending December 31, 2024. In response to a question raised, L. Markle clarified that the accounts receivable amount of \$250 relates to the newsletter advertisements and the sundry receivable is for the auctions and clothing.

On Motion by Ben Eby and seconded by Brad Comfort it was,
RESOLVED that the Financial Report be accepted as presented. Motion carried as evidenced by a show of hands.

8. **BREED IMPROVEMENT REPORT**

L. Markle referred members to the breed improvement report included in the annual report. L. Markle presented highlights of the report noting:

- Continue to grow the genomic test program; focus to increase number of animals tested with reduced rates.
- Lactanet took an active role in contacting AI to test bulls not SNP tested.
- Association sponsored project for microsatellite samples.
- 2025 focus for the Committee will be a review of awards and master breeder program.

9. **FIELDMAN REPORT**

Russell Gammon provided a report noting that the memberships/registrations were at an all-time high in 2024 and genomics testing growth with 491 animals tested. The 2026 World Conference is being held in Australia.

10. **PRESENATION OF AWARDS**

10.1 **Superior Production Awards** – An overview of the awards was presented. Certificates

will be sent out after the meeting.

- 10.2 **Canadian Guernsey Association Star Breeder Award** – Paul MacLeod presented the Star Breeder Award to Eby Manor Ltd.

At this point, Russell Gammon assumed the role of Chair.

11. **ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

- 11.1 **Nominations** – five (5) open positions for Directors to be elected to the Board of Directors this year. The Chair noted that Rob Forster will not be standing for election and at this point, the floor was opened for further and other nominations. FIELDMAN'S REPORT

FORGING INTO THE FUTURE WITH GUERNSEY GUSTO!

We regularly overflow with thankfulness because of new activity surrounding the Guernsey breed in Canada and around the world.

We see this report as having two segments — a look at where we have been and where we are today, and then a look at the future.

YESTERDAYS AND TODAY

What has been done and is happening today is the foundation for the future. This is how we have invested and are investing our efforts. *We welcome input on how we can be more effective and how we can accelerate the breed-building process!*

VISIBILITY AND DEMAND

You are all aware that we have been especially active on social media during the period from January 2024 up to today. A total of 990 posts were made on Facebook in 2024, followed by 1,752 in 2025, and to date in 2026 we are at 308. This totals 3,050 posts in this time period.

We have adopted an approach of focusing more on quality of material with a lighter emphasis on volume. The World Guernsey Cattle Federation does excellent work on Instagram at World Guernsey. We include a high volume of material from other countries to let our followers know about Guernsey efforts and progress elsewhere. **We recently surpassed 7,000 followers, and in many months we attract up to 200,000 views.**

The National Show in Ancaster is another way to increase visibility of the breed. It is good to see new exhibitors in recent years.

Challenge: What other avenues should we be following to raise visibility of the breed? Can we effectively meet demand when that demand grows?

Guernseys appear in multi-breed sales and usually attract solid interest. There have been both domestic and international sales of embryos in recent months, and we have worked to foster those sales. We have also directed potential buyers for embryos or live cattle to appropriate sources.

Interest in investing in Guernsey genetics comes in waves—quieter periods followed by bursts of inquiries. We work to connect those wishing to invest with the right resources.

Kudos to all those who are processing Guernsey milk into fluid and solid products! We are aware of four operations doing so in Central and Western Canada. Success for these companies increases demand for Guernsey milk and eventually Guernsey cattle.

Kudos to all 4-H members and their supporters who work with Guernseys! You are helping raise breed visibility, especially among younger generations.

BUILDING THE FUTURE

Everything we do has some form of impact on the future of the breed.

In the immediate future, several events at the annual meeting hold great potential for breed development. We are excited about what Jim Van Patter will share with attendees — we are sure he will challenge and inspire discussion and thinking.

The annual meeting will also mark the release of new goals for the Association and the breed in Canada. These follow the superb work of the Breed Genetic Improvement Committee in reviewing and updating the awards program. Holstein staff provided very helpful background information during this review.

The meeting will also act as a launching point for Canada hosting the next World Guernsey Conference in 2029.

We have received interest from another breed association in including Guernseys in a multi-breed sale later this year.

The American Guernsey Association has recently released a comprehensive new Strategic Plan. The material in this plan will be valuable as the CGA considers how to move the breed ahead in Canada.

It appears that the WGCF will be seeking input from national Guernsey associations on how to build the future of the breed and how the WGCF can support that process.

In all of this, genomic testing of as many Canadian Guernseys as possible remains paramount. If we can help in any way, please let us know.

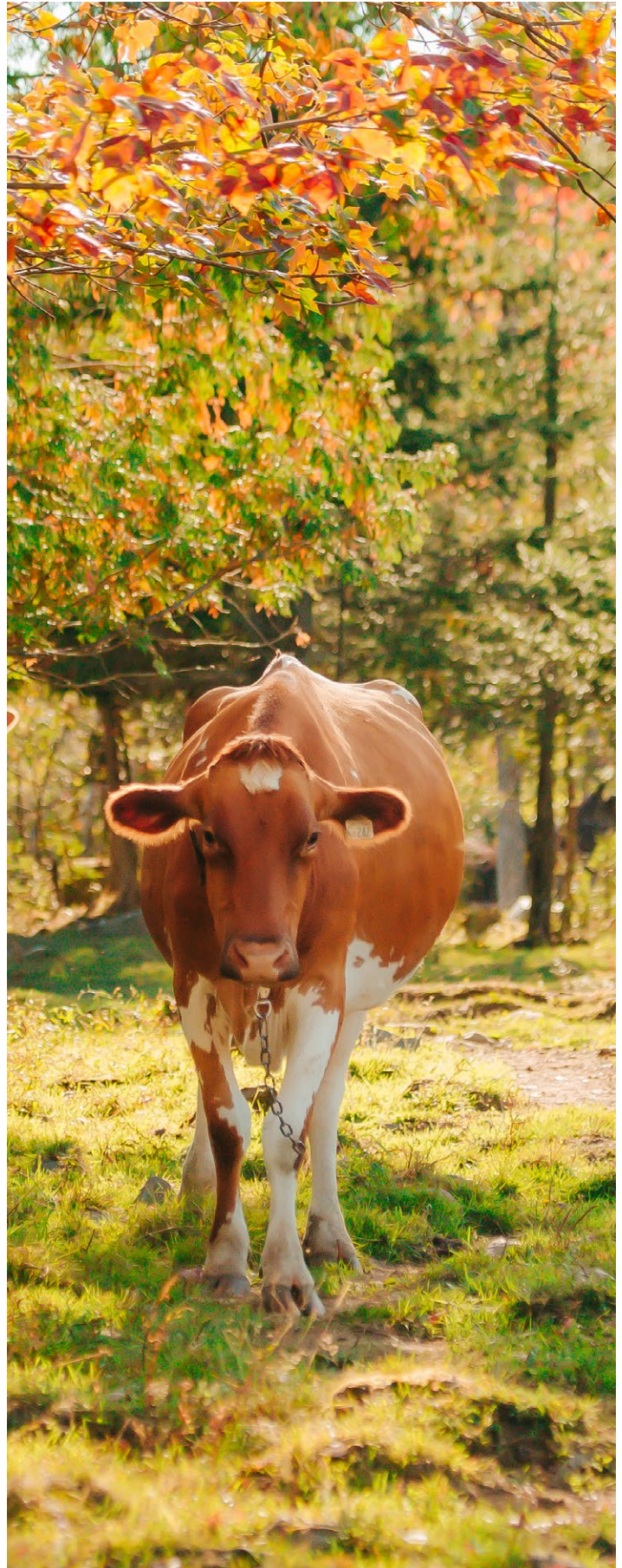
Please let us know how we can help you achieve more success with Guernseys. What can we do better?

Breed Improvement Committee Report

The Breed Improvement Committee had a productive year, with genomic testing initiatives, and refinements of award and recognition programs. The dedication and expertise of committee members played a key role in ensuring that these initiatives were completed.

The implementation of Subclinical Ketosis (SCK) in genetic evaluations began in December 2025, reported as the Metabolic Disease Resistance (MDR) value within the Health & Welfare subindex (HWI) of the LPI. During the year, the committee reviewed the weighting of SCK relative to Somatic Cell Score (SCS) to ensure balanced and accurate evaluations.

The Association continued to invest in genomic testing, offering financial support to reduce testing costs for herds enrolled in Milk Recording or Classification programs. A total of 117 stored microsatellite samples were retrieved and re-tested using DNA technology. More than 598 Guernsey animals were genomic tested through the Association's genomic testing initiative. These expanded results significantly increase the number of animals contributing to genomic evaluations, strengthening the genetic base and improving the accuracy of evaluations across the breed.

The committee met several times throughout the year to review criteria for all current awards. Recommended updates were reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors, with changes implemented at the end of December 2025.

Award Program Updates

- Superior Production Records: Updated to include Composite BCA above the national average.
- No changes were made to the Honour Roll, Marshdene Farms Award, Callumlea Farm Award, Lindrian Farms Award, Chinook Crest Dairy Award, or Lindley Farm Award.
- Lifetime Production Certificates: Adjusted required fat plus protein kilograms.
- Gartmore Farms Award: Added CompBCA requirements.

The Star Brood and Master Breeder recognitions have now been automated to run annually.

Master Breeder Eligibility:

- Based on National Herd Averages provided by Lactanet.
- Members with more than five total publishable records are considered.
- A minimum of three average registrations per year and at least 15 points per registration is required for qualification.
- Animals born and bred within time frame
