Fieldman's Reflections

Beginnings...of the Golden Guernsey kind!

One of the best things about starting an article entitled "Beginnings" is determining where to start based on multiple great options in the Guernsey breed. Things are looking up!

How about starting with a re-beginning?!

The Eby family at Eby Manor Ltd. held their first open farm day in the summer of 2019. Then along came a global disruption - you know what we speak of!

The Eby's were back at it on June 15th with their second open farm day! The day could not have been any better regarding the weather in their region of Southwestern Ontario and crowd volume!

The Eby's wanted to say thank you to their customers for the enthusiasm for Eby Manor products and growing sales of their milk, cheese and yogurt. Hundreds accepted the invite to tour the farm on a sunny clear day with ideal temperatures. The estimated number of attendees is between 550 and 600!



Options included tours of the milking cow barn and pens for older heifers. These tours had well-informed guides and modest numbers of folks in each tour group. Also, on the docket were tours of the facilities for younger heifers, wagon rides around the fields and the presence of a number of associated companies whose products are available through the on-farm dairy market.

Speaking of the dairy market, business was very brisk and eventually line ups to enter the store developed. As the crowds entered the barn tours Jim Eby explained that Eby Manor Golden Guernsey products are available in over 200 stores in Southwestern and Central Ontario! He also noted that as demand for products has grown, arrangements have been made to access milk from nearby herds owned by the Horst and Martin families! Several former and current Guernsey folks were part of the great crowds! You'll find a bevy of photos from this highly successful day elsewhere on page 14-15 in this issue of the news!

We are inspired by plans to do some embryo transfer work with superior herd members on the part of some Ontario Guernsey owners. These folks are also searching for outstanding cattle to serve as additional embryo donors.

In May, while in the Maritimes, we had the inspirational opportunity to visit with Iain Anderson in the Sussex area of New Brunswick who has recently purchased a fine Guernsey heifer from the West family at Beaverwood Farm in the same province. Iain and his family maintain a herd of Holsteins and Jerseys in a freestyle barn, Iain is also a sheep breeder and the family keep some horses too!

In addition, in the Maritimes in May the Colorful Collection Canadian Kind Sale was hosted by the Dillman family of Musqie Valley Farms in Halifax County, NS. The Dillman's maintain a dairy herd containing five dairy breeds. The multi-breed sale was a successful event. Within the sale a Guernsey heifer, bred and consigned by Eby Manor, was one of the higher sellers. She sold in absentia and remains in Ontario; a pre-sale open house attracted a sizable crowd.

Those stopping in to see sale animals also inspected the evolving Guernsey portion of the herd operating in partnership with the Fuller's from Nova Scotia's Annapolis Valley!

Exciting news was shared at the June Canadian Guernsey Association board meeting regarding the Association's genomic testing initiative. As of the meeting time, over 330 animals had been genotyped through the program which was launched in March 2023! By the time you are reading this article samples from an additional 108 head, or more will have been processed. This will bring the total tested via the program to at least 440 head.

Further plans are to genotype as many animals, tested via former microsatellite stored samples since the early 2000s, is possible to add to the pool of animals genotyped! We are actively working with owners of herds, that are involved in genetic improvement programs, that have yet to be part of the program to expand the reference population of genotyped animals! We will easily surpass 500 animals through the program this year and drive on to 600 or more! The board has, at least temporarily, extended the program. Contact us to see about involving your registered animals!

In other exciting news you'll read a report of the Guernsey Summer Picnic hosted by the Comfort family of the Niagara Peninsula in this issue. Visitors will have a chance to tour the new milking facilities at Comfort Farms!

On and on the beginnings go! Hoping to see a new Guernsey Farm sign during the summer top!

We are also looking forward to the 2024 National Show at Ancaster Fair on Thursday, September 19th!

We continue to consult with dairy producers who wish to launch/begin a Guernsey segment in their dairy herds. We direct them to Guernsey owners in their regions who may have foundation stock available.

Beginnings, we love them! The Guernsey breed is full of them! Contact us if we can help you with a Guernsey beginning!

It has been no secret that the Fuller family in Nova Scotia have a keen interest in the Guernsey breed. The breed has been in their blood for many years, involving many generations of this family. The foundation of this passion for Guernsey's started with Frank Saunders, grandfather of Bruce Fuller and great grandfather of Jennika Fuller.

In 1934, Frank Saunders formed Valley View Farm which was centered around breeding and milking quality guernsey cows. Frank was also a relative on his father's side to the Borden's of the well-known Tannery Hill Guernsey's. Under Frank's careful eye and expertise in breeding and genetics, Valley View Farm developed into one of the most respected Guernsey farms in Atlantic Canada. Valley View Guernsey in time became the genetic base of many Guernsey lines in the Maritimes, and even spreading as far as Ontario and Manitoba.

A highlight in Frank's involvement in breeding Guernsey cows was to have a bull selected for an A.I. unit in Ontario. This "famous" bull was Valley View Billy. Frank realized the genetic improvements that could be gained through A.I. he was instrumental in establishing a sub-unit of the Nova Scotia Animal Breeders' Cooperative in Kings County and was very active on the Young Sire Selection Committee at the Provincial level. He was also a proud supporter of 4-H, each year donating a Guernsey calf to a deserving member. At that time, it was called a local calf club rather than 4-H. His children, including Bruce Fuller's mother and

From a young age, Bruce accompanied his grandfather to many exhibitions throughout the province and Maritimes, often even making the trip to the Royal Winter Fair in Ontario each year.

He spent many summers at Valley View Farm helping Frank with his cattle and farm and helping prepare and show his was often the recipient of Premier Breeder awards.

He has also served as judge at many shows including the Canadian National Exhibition and the Royal Winter Fair.

Showing his grandfather's Guernsey's just wasn't enough to satiate Bruce's love for the breed and developing show quality Guernsey cows. So, in 1979 Bruce started his own Guernsey herd, under his farm Minas View Farms. Bruce too became a familiar place at exhibitions. Bruce also developed a strong Guernsey herd, following in Frank's footsteps. Bruce and his Guernsey's became a force to be reckoned with in the show ring. One of Bruce's most prized cows, Glenville G. C. Velma, went on to win many breed and supreme grand championships, some highlights being Supreme Champion at the Atlantic Winter Fair, and coming 2nd at the Royal Winter Fair.

Eventually, as life happens, the Valley View Guernsey's and Minas View Guernsey's came to a stop, the Fuller family leaving the dairy industry altogether. Have no fear, this is not where this story ends. In 2015, Jennika Fuller decided to start showing dairy in 4-H, starting off with a Holstein calf. What Jennika longed for was to follow her families roots in the Guernsey breed. Thus began the search for a Guernsey calf for the following show year. Having no Guernsey farms in Nova Scotia at the time, the Fuller's eventually connected with Comfort Farms in Ontario and purchased Jennika's first Guernsey, Comfort Farm's Jenelle. The passion for the breed was re-ignited in Bruce and began for Jennika that year and has been going strong ever since, increasing their herd and improving genetics through their partnership with Musgie Valley Farm. More information on this partnership is to follow in the upcoming journal.
