Report from the “Fergus Office” of CGA

Well, well, 2020 has turned out to be a highly unusual year on this planet. We have all learned to grow in unexpected ways and sometimes in ways we would rather avoid but we are carrying on!

On the Canadian Guernsey front this year is reversing trends in the world and is a year of growth and progress. Our twin goals will be to make that growth sustainable so that it continues and expands.

Following a spring when it seemed that scores of people in Western Canada were hunting for Guernsey cows as family cows activity climbed to a higher level. We are glad that when people think of a quiet, easy to manage cow with high solids golden milk they think of a Guernsey. Unfortunately, Guernseys are scarce in Western Canada so we suspect these searches for a Golden cow were often futile.

Our future will be much more governed by rising demand for Guernseys in ongoing, modern day dairy herds. The potential interest in and demand for Guernseys was proven by the release of an article on Eby Manor and their product line of Golden Guernsey dairy products in an issue of Progressive Dairyman. There was a very pleasing amount of positive reaction to this article including a number of expressions of interest in the breed. We have conferred with the Canadian contact for PD and it is possible that the article will appear in the French/Quebec edition late in 2020 or early in 2021. We directed people who followed up on this article to appropriate sources. One aspect of our status that release of this article proved is that we need more high quality Guernsey heifers to fuel expansion into a growing number of herds.

Activity regarding importation of cattle and embryos from the USA continues strong with more available. These importations have continued on into the summer with more high class embryos heading north, while a nice lot of embryo transfer calves have been born in Quebec. On the domestic front our numbers in Eastern Ontario were nicely bolstered over the summer. Chantelle Leslie and Erik Leach altered the profile of their herd west of Ottawa with the purchase of approximately 20 head from a number of herds in Western Ontario. These folks are dynamic young dairy farmers and have become enamored by the bovines they refer to as

“Orange cows”. We are excited for Chantelle and Erik and their family and for the breed! Grow, Guernseys, grow!

We are excited that Semex is back in the business of buying and owning Guernsey sires! Their first purchase, a Herald-P son of the 95% Jazzy cow at Springhill in Ohio has the potential and credentials to be a valuable bull! Semex is now interested in a second and maybe third younger bull. If you have well-bred bull calves born make sure let us know! In terms of available bulls ST continues to nurture their stable of intriguing Guernsey bulls. Ed Crossland’s Masterpiece Genetics program is moving ahead quickly and a high percentage of their bulls will be available in Canada soon!

Demand for local food products is on a definite rising trajectory. Interest in Eby Manor Golden Guernsey and Laiterie Changnon Guernsey products is growing at the same rate. We hear a bevy of glowing comments about these product lines!

Our list of late summer/early autumn (can this time of the year be here already?) projects is growing fast. Included on the roster is completion of the National Breeders Cup contest, a first draft of a strategic plan and an online auction to raise funds for CGA operations. With regard to the latter we have a few items for the auction but “ have room” for many more. Please let us know if you have any lots of consign so we can launch the boat and attract some great bids.

Our thoughts continue to rest with the Kaiser family in Western Quebec with regard to their tragedy in early July. We want them to know that we are all here for them and ready to help in any way that we can.

Please remember that Morgan Sangster of Holstein Canada is available to help with any interest in Guernseys in Western Canada. In the Atlantic region Natasha McKillop stands ready to assist with any Guernsey related matters. These two highly motivated people are representatives of Holstein Canada. It is good to remember that on August 17, 2020 the Canadian dairy industry will celebrate the 15th anniversary of the launch of the All Breeds Dairy Classification Program with service delivered by Holstein Canada staff. What a slam dunk success story this hymn of cooperation between breeds has been!

Ongoing thanks to Morgan and Natasha and the CGA board and, as always, the person who more than holds the show on the road with efficiency and a continually pleasant attitude and approach, Jessie Weir, Administrator par excellence!

We'll close by making reference to one of the most passionate Guernsey sparkplugs on the planet, Digby Gribble in the United Kingdom. Digby constantly reminds us of definite and solid expressions of interest in the Guernsey breed in a large number of countries. Demand for Guernseys is growing in Canada, YES but also in many other lands and nations on the planet. The challenge for established Guernsey countries is to create a superior, modern, profitable product for new followers and owners of the breed in fertile new fields for the breed!

Are we up to the challenge? WHY YES!

World Guernsey Conference Summary

2/6

It's then the drive to Indiana the next day, where we get to see the Villa Crest herd.

Villa Crest is a stunningly beautiful white barn filled with Golden Guernsey cows, operated by Verl & Gretchen Weaver. There are approximately 35 pristine milking cows, with a focus on individual high cow production and high classification scores – Verl's aim is Excellent 100,000lb (45,000kg) cows – currently the herd is averaging 86 points with a RHA of over 9072kg milk, 5%F 3.5%P.

The barn is spotless, the cows are washed and just about show ring ready in the bright and airy space – incredible given the barn was built around the mid-late 1800s, and yet the ceiling height is comfortably high. There is a combination of tie-stall and free pens in the first barn, and an added free stall allow for optimal cattle movement. The lineup of animals in the tie-stall is stunning. The animals are long, lean and dripping dairyness. There are only stunning udders with tremendous width and ligament strength.

In the dry pen we see the matriarch Mar Ral Royal Martha EX94, still moving cleanly. The calves are well grown and with great rib as youngsters, with the older heifers out grazing pasture. A tremendous farm.

We enjoy dinner with the Weaver family courtesy of the Indiana Breeders Association.

3/6

Another early start - from Goshen we head onwards to the Land of Living farm, where the John & Bonnie Ayars are hosting their World Conference sale & dispersal. We see a great herd of quality heifers and cows from some deep pedigreed families, Aaron, Latimer, Fame American Pie and more featuring in the sale line up - all long, open ribbed with plenty of width. We enjoy the hospitality with a great lunch and of course Land of Living ice cream. From LOL we then head onto Hilliard, OH.

4/6

We're up and out of the hotel early in order to make it to the ST Genetics Ohio Heifer centre. It's the largest permitted farm in the county, with a 9,800 animal capacity, and currently travelling at 6,500 animals on site. The sheds are wide and expansive and each hold animals at different life stages. The site was originally acquired to foster an export business particularly to Russia and Turkey, but then adapted to now run a milking barn and embryo recipients from both the high genetic merit animals on site, and the Wisconsin facility.

There's an incredible amount of technology and process being applied here, with Lely robots, cameras in the maternity pens, and all animals getting blood tests and DNA verifications at birth.

ST have acquired Guernsey genetics recently and are looking to create their own unique breeding line like the Holsteins.

There are 300 bulls onsite currently undergoing genomic reviews to determine who will continue into AI. The company aims to buy high quality females to breed males suitable for the industry and make profits off semen sales. The majority of cows and heifers are embryo recipients, with an average of 25 ETs per week, and 70-100 transfers per week. There are multiple Guernsey pregnancies due soon from the first acquisitions, so we look forward to seeing trials involving Guernseys and the golden girls competing with the Holsteins to prove their efficiency and superior milk quality.

From ST we head onwards to Pine Grove farm. Run by Reuben Miller and his family in the middle of Amish country in Walnut creek. The Millers milk 30 cows that are mostly Guernseys, having started in 1946 when Reuben's father married a Guernsey girl. The Jerseys have been in the herd since 1993. The cows graze until milking, and enjoy a mix of corn silage and grain mix during their time in the tie-stall waiting to be milked.

When selecting sires, Clayton selects based on depth of pedigree. They have a wide variety of sires used, including Conqueror and his son Logo, Grumpy, Copper, Gary and Bruce.

The barn is immaculate and the cows are in great condition, with quality mammaries throughout the whole lineup. The Millers have been selecting in recent times to improve rear leg rear view, and this is evident as the cows stand square with high, wide rear udders.

Reuben & Esther join us for dinner at Der Dutchman, and enjoy authentic Amish fare next our wonderful inn. We're also lucky enough to enjoy a buggy ride with Reuben's horse & cart!

5/6

In the morning we head off to experience the Amish cultural centre – a great insight into the Amish & Mennonite way of life. We learn a great deal about the formation of the religion and how the Amish came to the to America. We have free time in the morning and explore the area, with Amish craftsmanship, antiques and food – Heini's cheese chalet is a local cheese plant making a range of different dairy products. In the afternoon, we travel across to Berlin and check out the antique malls before driving across to visit Springhill. Chris Lang and family have committed to the dairy industry and quality cows by working to build the ultimate in cow comfort. New barns on a new site with a focus on quality rather than quantity are designed to be easy on both the cow and the handler. The Lang family are celebrating 200 years of farming this year and keeping the farm as a family. The herd is currently 90-100 cows with the majority being Guernseys. Holsteins are in the milking herd and being used as recipients, except for a select few to link in with the Lang's well-established Holstein herd.

The rain is threatening and so we move to the calf barn in case of thunderstorms. As we look through the young heifers, an alert comes out for a tornado alert. We continue until

the town alert blares loud and the alerts are for the direct region! We head to the old barn (good thing there's a couple of Guernseys to look at while we're in there) before the storm dissipates. We're able to then recommence looking at outstanding heifers by multiple sires from many descendants of Joke and Jazzy.

We enjoy a fantastic home cooked dinner before enjoying the milking cows in the lovely new open, airy and light sheds – where the top show cows are in their own pens, the free stall cows are in a bed pack with Holsteins, proving the competitive nature of the Guernsey cow. There are many well recognised faces – Jasmin, Jazz, Topeka and more. Such contented cows, with beautiful frames, youthful udders and strong feet & legs make for a wonderful evening – complete with the entertainment!

6/6

In the morning we depart Ohio for Pennsylvania. Soon after crossing the state border we are at Trotacre farm, where multiple generations of the Trotter family are farming. Jimmy & Marylou bought the farm in 1942, and Guernseys have been a part of the farm since then.

The family has a small ice cream shop that supports the local community, but the main focus is now moving to launch a coop with Golden Guernsey milk selling a naturally golden product. The partnership is being developed with 5 other Guernsey breeders to ship Guernsey milk to a specialty processor and generate a better return for the members for their superior product. We enjoy a family lunch in front of a group of heifers, with Ernie featuring prominently as sire, along with Ladysman and Copper. We then move across to the calf pens, and look through the dry cows – Cara's favourite Tiller Maelyn is a strong powerful cow, currently dry but with 3 calves, she will be quite the 6 year old with her next calf. In the milking herd there is a nice range of cows sired by different sires – VIP, Jonathon, Grumpy and other bulls. As the animals walk out the barn and past the feedpad, the cows demonstrate their great feet & legs, silky udders with great width and medium stature. The cows walk out to join the rest of the Holstein herd grazing on the pasture.

We then head over to Rivendale farm. The owner is a passionate supporter of the dairy industry and has set up a brand new barn with automatic Lely robots to milk the purebred Jersey herd.

The cows are housed in a compost pack that is ripped 2x per day by a rotor tiller with spikes – the bedding is actually a longer bark that originally arrived by accident but has now proven to be more a more economical choice and better for the cows. In the show barn the cows are in individual box stalls/ large tie-stalls which are then connected to pasture which the cows enjoy in the evenings.

With the robots they could milk 180 but are now looking to review the numbers down to 70 cows in order to reduce the number of FT workers on farm. The cows are all A2A2, and the milk is sent to be processed into both liquid milk and ice cream. The dairy is currently buying cream to keep up with demand and keeping up to the soft serve. The milk is standardised to a 3.5% fat test and supplied into 7 stores

(after buying the business with 5 currently). They have a repertoire of 36 flavours, with 10 currently in production. Riverdale are nice enough to bring us containers of 'Pirates Treasure' – a specialty flavour made for the Penn Pirates, along with a delicious chocolate milk, and plain milk for us to take with us to our hotel to be able to enjoy decent milk whilst in the hotels with 'non-dairy creamer'.

From Riverdale we then head across to Washington PA.

7/6

Today is a bit of fun – we explore the Meadows Racetrack and Stables to kick off the morning, followed then by the Wild World of Animals Private Zoo – where exotic animals are part of an exciting if a little dangerous family – lions, tigers and bears!

We have lunch visiting Twin Brook farm, where John and Becky Marchezak host us before we have a tour through the barn – Patty & John McMurray have a number of their All-Americans here, and the barn is full of soft silky uddered dairy cows – a couple of nice Freedoms being a personal standout. There are some beautiful open ribbed Latimer and Fame heifers, and some early calved Lil Ernies – such a flat dairy bone and udder texture that spells milk!

To round out the afternoon we visit the Barnyard Petting Zoo. I never knew I needed to pat a baby zebra, but it was certainly fun. Surrounded by a menagerie of various creatures it was certainly a light hearted affair.

The evening was at the McMurray residence where we got to see an amazing array of Guernsey memorabilia, including the original 'Future's Promise' and a number of classic Guernsey paintings and milk bottles. At dinner, Colin Gilbert, an Australian who had promised Patty he would come 'only if Dolly Parton sang him Happy Birthday', was surprised with a local impersonator for the evening. The local branch of Guernsey Youth was active and great to see them being involved across the evening. Ballroom dancing for those with working knees capped off the evening.

8/6

Our morning started at Maple Bottom farm, looking at the 25 Guernseys within a mixed breed herd, being milked in a retrofitted DeLaval VMS. In this freestall barn the Guernseys were doing well competing with the other breeds

From the Bakers it is onwards to Snider Homestead Farm.

The WGCF came through here last time and were impressed with the Altann cow – now her descendants make up the many of the cows in the bright and airy tie stall barn. There are some ripper mature Aaron daughters in the stalls, but Hummer EX94, a '07 Adacka daughter is a testament to longevity, Ashanti EX94, a Garrett daughter was a stylish case of aging gracefully. There were some very stylish Phoenix heifers in milk as well as older cows, and a nice young Kakadu called Amorosa straight out of the Altann family that will be turning heads! The older age of some of their mature cows, and the vitality they still display is lovely to see – truly mature cows, with big open ribbed frames on medium statured cows, with strong creases on the ligament keeping teat placement

tight, yet the udder above the hock; with plenty of width throughout. The Gables use a wide variety of sires, and the calf pens have a mix of Charming, Ernie and Ladysman. The dry cows are out on grass, all moving on great feet and legs.

Grabbing delicious milk and cookies it was then onwards to Misty Meadows. Here the cows are in custom pens, and the star of the show Misty Meadows Rebel Suite EX92, being direct out of Suede EX94. There was a variety of sires old and new, but each mating was resulting in well balanced, stylish open ribbed heifers in pens! Dinner was at Misty Meadows, where it was great to catch up with a number of the local breeders.

9/6

Travel to our conference facility in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, we kick off the conference with a welcome dinner for all participants.

10/6

The sessions kick off, with presentations on genomics, genetic testing and herd improvement from the representatives working with the USDA and Zoetis. For lunch we travel to Warwick Manor farm for lunch – of course enjoying the delicious dairy produce made with Yoder milk!

We walk through the immaculate barn admiring the 60 cows who are contributing to the RHA of 9900kg M @5.9%F 3.3%P. The cows are all strong, with width from muzzle through to pin set with incredible mammaries – ligament being a strength. From one end of the barn to the other, open ribbed, well framed cattle with good feet & legs with amazing udder underneath – it was good to be standing amongst them during the demonstrations on youth showmanship, and then the classification breakdown of a young cow as the AGA has Holstein USA contracted for classifying.

Dinner was at Yoders, with a tour of the factory facilities being a great highlight to see where butter, milk and ice cream are processed with super low food miles.

11/6

The Tuesday is country reports day – with updates from all around the world, comparing and investigating genetic trends within the breed as well as avenues to improve the population size. The afternoon covers trends in milk marketing, and a panel discussion about marketing your own milk, value adding and distancing Golden Guernsey milk from being just a commodity product. The evening is spent enjoying a Dinner and a Show of Camelot at the Dutch Apple Theatre.

12/6

This was a lively discussion after the presentation from the Jersey association on how they have made rapid progress in the last 20 years, and the discussion point of marketing and expanding the Guernsey breed.

A segment on the importance of succession planning linked in nicely to an afternoon of Guernsey youth programs – demonstrating the link the AGA has with its youth program and encouraging the next generation into

being informed and proud ambassadors for the breed. A lively round of Quiz Bowl was certainly entertaining.

With the conclusion of the conference we enjoyed the dinner and auction, with not too much partying afterwards due to the early departure for the post conference tour!

13/6

It was back on the road upwards to New York to visit Ripley Farms in Moravia. The Ripley family have acquired Hillcrest Dairy and are currently processing and marketing their own Golden Guernsey product. The family is milking 160 Guernseys, with the 320 Holsteins being used as suppliers for the acquired brand, and as embryo recipients. The herd has a big focus on DPR whilst also looking at production, with a wide variety of bulls being used, including their own, Cordell, Royalty and Toby.

After a delicious lunch provided by the NY Breeders association & the Ripley family, drinking Hillcrest/Ripley milk and enjoying Golden Guernsey cheese and butter, we were able to tour the facility the family has bought and discuss further questions that arose during the conference about challenges and successes associated with marketing your own milk.

14/6

The Friday was slightly different, taking a tour of the West Point Military Academy, and the landscaped gardens of Wethersfield Estate before travelling to Coon Brothers Farm – where Smithfield Guernseys is farmed across multiple generations. With a RHA 6880kg M 5.1%F, 3.4%P providing milk that supplies Hudson Valley Fresh, there were plenty of high indexing cows to be seen in the open freestall barns. Great udders on Novak daughters, Copper & Logo daughters were standouts as well as some great older Aaron Levi and Double L daughters. A standout was seeing some of the top ranked CPI cows in the breed doing what they did best – eating and making milk! The heifer pens were full of young sires and growing well making it an exciting space to watch.

An enjoyable meal thanks to the Coon family for dinner.

15/6

Our last day was a bit of a treat – we drove to Del's Dairy Farm. Del's markets as Dutchess Creamery, selling full fat whole milk and flavoured milk, with production of ice cream in trial stages for launch. All the milk is from the pedigree Guernseys who are milked in a freestall barn that has a Galaxy Astrea robot. The animals have plenty of space and comfort as they build up their market, but we have a great discussion about marketing tools and consumer insights. The cows have been acquired from multiple herds, such as Donnybrook, Dales G and Welcome Stock Farm.

With lunch provided, we are also treated to Dutchess Creamery ice cream before heading off to conclude the tour.

Registrar's Message

Greetings from the Registrar's office,

I hope you are all doing well on the farm and enjoying the summer! This summer, and the 2020-year have been very different for all of us! Back in March, at the onset of Covid-19, I began working remotely from home. Currently, with some restrictions lifted, I am splitting the workdays between home and the office at Holstein Canada. Thank you for your patience as we all get used to this 'new' normal of covid life.

In regards to Registrar work this year, so far there are just shy of 200 head of cattle registered, which includes imports. Classification is at 90 animals, fewer cows than usual compared to last year at this same time. With classification services not on farms for a couple of months, however, the reduced number of classified cows is to be expected. Right now, all classifiers are on the farm again working hard to bring those numbers back up!

As you know, Holstein Canada had to make the difficult decision in March to postpone classification, proAction, and other herd visits. As of June 1st, we began a phased approach for the resumption of classification services. Since that time, we have visited all provinces except for British Columbia. The classifiers hope to visit that province near the end of August. 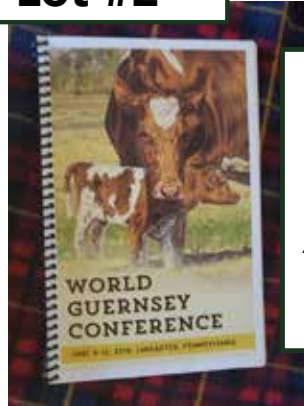

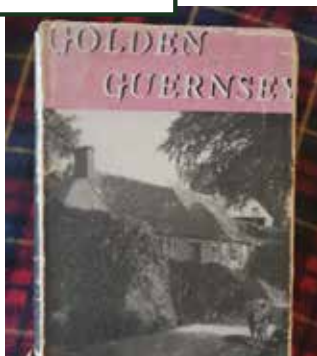

Coloured Breed Highlights - August 2020 -

All Top 5 Guernsey LPI Leaders Experience Minor Change Under 60 Points

The Top 5 LPI list this round includes the same sires as in April and no young sire achieves proven status. The breed leading sire duo stay solid with Pine Ridge Double L at #1 LPI (#3 Fat) and his son, Dairyman Double Dawson, still follows at #2 LPI (#2 Fat). Experiencing minor reshuffling, the other Top 5 LPI sires include the same group with Coulee Crest Grumpy Legend at #3 LPI (tied #7 Conformation), Idle Gold E Challenge at #4 LPI, and Trotacre Enhancer Lewis now in #5 LPI position (#3 Milk, tied #8 Fat, tied #3 Protein).

Similar to the top sire list, the pair of cows leading the Top 5 LPI list remain firm with Eby Manor D L Indy at #1 LPI (#2 Fat) and Lindrian Pamper Bear ET 200 at #2 LPI (tied #8 Conformation). The next two LPI positions are now occupied by cows that climb the LPI rankings this round, namely Guernsey View Urma's Expense from #5 to #3 LPI position (#6 Fat) and Jens Gold Profit Eunice from #8 to #4 LPI (#3 Milk, tied #5 Fat, #1 Protein). Glen Haven Lewis Lana rounds off the Top 5 list at #5 LPI (tied #5 Fat, #7 Protein). The highest newly indexed cow this round is Jens Gold Novak Video (dam is Grumpy Legend), who makes her debut at #50 LPI but also becomes the new breed leader for Milk and is tied at #2 Protein.
